SOD FACTS

- Sod can also be called turf or grass.
- There are about 46.5 million acres of turf in the U.S. An acre is about the size of a football field.
- Up to 90% of a grass plant's weight is the roots.
- A grass lawn can be 14 degrees cooler than dirt and 30 degrees cooler than asphalt.
- Grass clippings are 90% water by weight.
- Sod can be planted almost any time of year.
- 50 square feet of turf releases enough oxygen to support a family of 4.
- Grass is good for preventing erosion because of its root system.
- There are several varieties of Sod. Each is used for different reasons and different climates:
 - Bermuda Grass
 - Centipiede Grass
 - Fescue
 - Kentucky Bluegrass
 - St Augustine Grass
 - And so many more!
- Sod can be used for lawns, sport fields, and landscapes.
